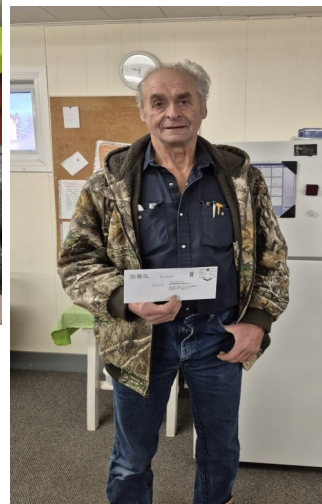

- Avoid clicking suspicious links sent via email.

Recognizing a company's name doesn't guarantee a link is real. If you are going to buy from a favourite store, open your browser and type in the store's name directly into the address bar or search for the site online.

- Read online reviews about a company.

It's easy to find customer reviews. While pondering an amazing deal, look the company up and read what other people are saying about it. Chances are you'll be able to find reviews quickly. If you can't find any at all, that's a big red flag!

- Don't buy over public Wi-Fi.

Public Wi-Fi is the least secure internet connection available. It's free to anyone and everyone, but there's also little security and virtually zero encryption in place. Anyone on the same network can hack into your device quickly and easily. Use your own data plan or wait until you get home.

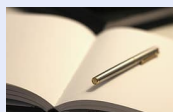
