It is committed to the saving of men's lives, improving the quality of life for men living with the disease, and puts focus on early detection. 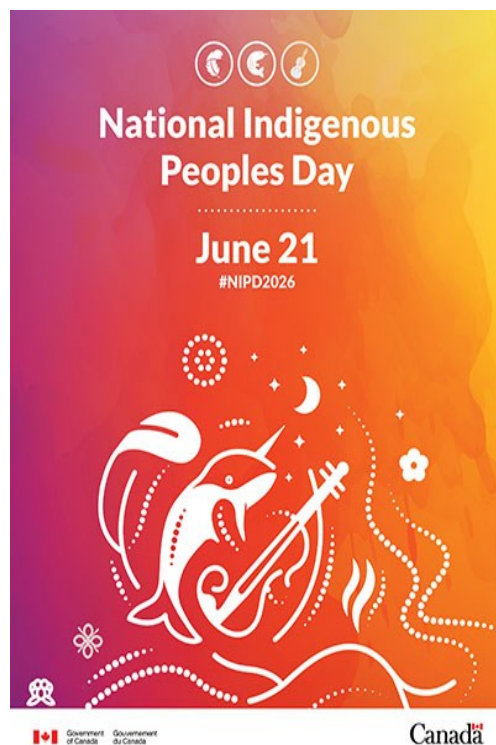

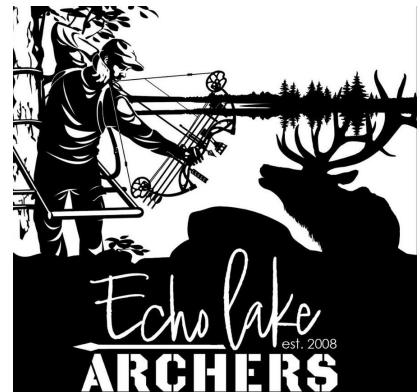

Tips for Safe Online Marketplace Transactions

Nothing says summertime like garage sales. The signs pop up in every neighbourhood as folks look to clear out their garages, sheds, basements, and storage units.

But in this new digital era, online marketplaces are a growing – and convenient – way of doing business. Whether it's Facebook Marketplace, a local garage sale group, or an online message board, there's no shortage of options to buy and sell as you scroll on your phone.

But as with most things in the digital world, fraudsters will take advantage of their opportunities. That's why it's important to take precautions to help protect your money when buying from online ads or marketplaces.

Keep a few simple rules in mind to ensure your transactions are secure:

1. **Meet the Seller Face-to-Face:** Whenever possible, meet the seller in person to verify the item before making any payments. This can help ensure the product is as described and reduces the risk of scams. Be cautious about sending a deposit to hold the item for you, as some fraudsters will use a fake address to trick you into sending money before you see the product.
2. **Keep Security Questions Safe:** When setting up Interac e-Transfer security questions, avoid including the answer within the question itself. If you need to provide the answer, send it to the recipient another way, like a text message or phone call. This adds an extra layer of protection against your e-Transfer being intercepted.
3. **Don't Share Reference Numbers:** Whenever you send an e-Transfer, it comes with a unique reference number. It's used to identify, trace, or verify the status of sent and received funds. Do not disclose this number to anyone, even if they ask. This information should remain confidential to protect your funds.
4. **Visit Rental Units Before Paying:** If you want to lease a rental unit, always visit the property in person before making any payments. That way, you know the property is legitimate and meets your expectations.

Online marketplace shopping can be a quick and easy way to buy and sell items in your community. But your safety is our priority. If you think you might have been scammed, call Cornerstone Credit Union right away at 1.855.875.2255 to report it. And if you just aren't sure about something, your local advisors can help you navigate the situation to keep your money safe.

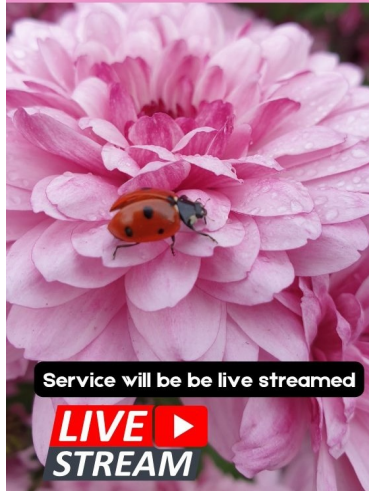
