## March is Fraud Prevention Month

The three most reported types of fraud are identity fraud, service fraud, and investment fraud – all designed to steal your money or to collect sensitive information like your social insurance number, banking details, or online account passwords.

When it comes to financial losses, the top three frauds are investment frauds, spear phishing, and romance scams.

One of the fastest growing forms of fraud is impersonation fraud. This happens when scammers pretend to be trusted organizations, websites, and even a person you might know to deceive you. This can lead to financial loss, identity theft, and other serious consequences.

Cornerstone Credit Union is part of a new coalition called **Stand Against Scams**. Many of Canada's leading financial, telecommunications, and technology companies have partnered with law enforcement and government sectors in this campaign to fight scams and protect Canadians.

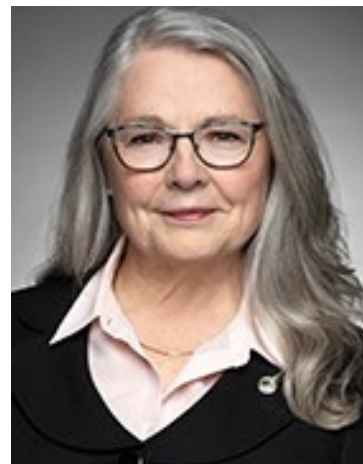



# Interview with an Author

Archerwill Library would like to introduce you to new local author Arie N. Streling. Ariela Angell uses this pen name for her creative writing which falls into the genre of Christian based fantasy stories.

Courageous Souls is the first book of her Warrior Saga. The setting is Enfinite Forest. Within the forest is a hidden society of warriors. The protagonist is Jevelyn Wudhaek, daughter of a great warrior general. She defies laws forbidding women from training to be warriors. Her motivation is the tragic death of her only brother. She blames herself for his death and seeks redemption disguised as a young man. With the aid of her best friend, she enters warrior training camp. If her true identity is discovered...well, we don't want to spoil it for you!

### ***When did you first discover writing?***

I have always loved writing. Language arts was my favourite subject in school. Words came like a second nature to me. I wrote stories in my younger days which now have evolved into a full size book/series.

### ***Why do you use a pen name?***

For personal reasons and security. I also think it is quite fun to have one.

### ***What is the motivation behind writing about a time when a woman had so little choice or control of her own destiny?***

The medieval world has always intrigued me and in that era women were looked down upon. I wanted to have a character who defies those unjust laws and who pursues her dream regardless of the consequences.

### ***Has this character challenged your perception of women in your own time?***

I wanted Jevelyn to be an example, to show the world that even when we women have more rights, we can stand up and do what is right and pursue dreams even when people all around doubt. Just as I have. Writing isn't a money making process it is giving your story to the world; to glorify the Father in Heaven and change the lives of those who read it.

Certainly! My younger siblings are all bursting with story ideas and some I believe will become great books that will be published in the future.
